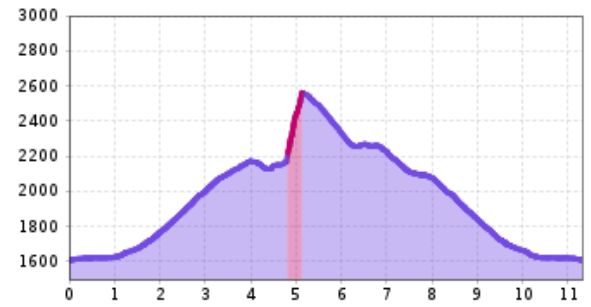


Attention!

access:

Starting point: Lienz, Tristach, Dolomitenhütte Ascent: Starting point at the Dolomitenhütte car park – on the standard route to Karlsbaderhütte until the "Marcher Stein" and from there in a north-easterly direction to the "Rudl Eller Weg" (blue signposts) – follow this until you come to a large cairn – straight after this, bear right on a steep grassy slope to the information board at the base of the wall. Alternative ascent: From Dolomitenhütte via the "Rudl Eller Weg" - via Weißsteinalm to the Hohe Törl (short rocky sections with secured points, max. A/B, - brief descent past the entrance to the Bügeleisenkante (note: risk of rock fall) – right after this, bear left and take the path up to the information board.

descent:

In a north-easterly direction to the not-difficult rocky ridge to the Laserzwand saddle – on the signposted standard route to Karlsbader Hütte, continuing to the Dolomitenhütte.
